I. Call to Order

Mayor Lawrence L. Jackson called the Public Hearing Meeting to order in the Village Board Chambers at 157 W. 144th Street at 6:46 p.m.

II. Roll Call

III. Presentation of Proposed Appropriation Ordinance

Mayor Jackson acknowledged Finance Director David Gonzalez. A handout was provided. Finance Director Gonzalez summarized the budget for fiscal year 2023. He referred to the General Fund which is the operating fund for the Village. Estimated revenue is as follows: Property taxes \$5,220.00, Licenses & Permits \$383,00, Intergovernmental Revenue – Sales Tax and Home Rule Tax and Utility Tax, \$4,551,500, Fine4s & Forfeitures, \$713,200, Charges for Services \$668,400, Investment Income, \$500, Miscellaneous \$1,076,600 and Transfers \$1,825,000 – State Income Tax. Total revenue expected from the General Fund is \$14,450,800. This is an increase of \$1,233,000 from last year. The increase is coming from Intergovernmental Revenue of \$734,000 more than budgeted from last year. Sales and Home Rule taxes have been coming in better than what was budgeted the prior year.
